European water utility management

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The Module aims at spreading knowledge on relevant and cutting edge water utility issues and promoting innovation within the water industry. Through the participation of international scholars, Phd, bachelors and masters students, Erasmus students, water utility managers, public authority staff, civil servants and policy makers, the Module could be a collaborative catalyst in fostering relationships via discussion, creation and dissemination of relevant and cutting-edge water utility management issues. Moreover, the proposal aims to equip students and young professionals with knowledge of European Union subjects relevant for their academic and professional lives and enhance their civic skills.

The teaching programme will be articulated into 5 units, that will be held in **the** second semester (from March to May). Each unit will consist of 12 academic teaching hours, and will be articulated in lectures and seminars.

Participants of each unit will receive an attendance certificate. In order to obtain 3 or 6 ECTS, participants are required to attend at least 3 or 5 units and to pass a test.

Erasmus students can attend 21 hours of lectures and seminars held in English passing the final test at the end of the course will let you achieve 3 ECTS.
